On April 2, 2019, Colorado Interstate Gas Company, L.L.C. ("CIG") received an informal inquiry from the Office of Energy Projects ("OEP") related to its proposed CIG High Plains Kiowa Lateral Expansion Project. Accordingly, CIG is herein filing with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission ("Commission") in Docket No. CP19-56-000, information addressing that inquiry.

Description of Proceeding

On January 24, 2019, CIG filed a prior notice request to Sections 157.205(b), 157.208(b), and 157.210 of the Commission's Regulations under the Natural Gas Act for authorization to construct and operate two laterals and metering facilities located in Weld County, Colorado. The project is referred to as the "CIG High Plains Kiowa Lateral Expansion Project".

Description of Information Being Filed

CIG is hereby submitting information addressing the April 2, 2019 informal inquiry from the OEP.
