



Sierrita is an approximately 61-mile, 36-inch diameter pipeline that currently provides 523,640 dekatherms per day (Dth/d) of firm transportation capacity and extends from Kinder Morgan, Inc.'s El Paso Natural Gas pipeline system, near Tucson, Arizona, to the United States-Mexico border near Sasabe, Arizona. The Sierrita pipeline system was built in 2014 and expanded in 2020 in partnership with Kinder Morgan Operating L.P. "A", a subsidiary of Kinder Morgan, Inc., MGI Enterprises US LLC, a wholly owned affiliate of Pemex Transformación Industrial, a subsidiary of Petróleos Mexicanos, the Mexican state-owned oil and gas company, and MIT Pipeline Investment Americas, Inc., a subsidiary of Mitsui & Co., Ltd. Sierrita interconnects with an existing natural gas pipeline in Mexico owned by IEnova and provides transportation service to growing markets in northwest Mexico.
